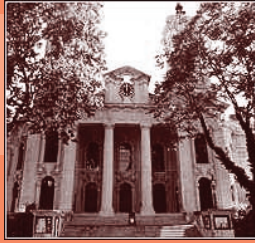

## Directions

Underground – Westminster (10 min walk) or St James's Park (District, Circle and Jubilee Lines)

Buses – 3, 77A to Millbank (Lambeth Bridge); C10, 507 to Horseferry Road (Lambeth Bridge); 88 to Marsham Street

British Rail – Victoria, Waterloo, Charing Cross

Car Parking – parking meters are in operation during the day, Monday–Friday. In the evenings and at weekends there is usually ample space locally

St John's, Smith Square is a short walk from Westminster Underground Station which takes you through one of the most historical parts of London, past Big Ben and the Houses of Parliament (on your left) with Westminster Abbey (on the right). A tree-lined section along Millbank (the north side of the Thames) takes you to a zebra crossing before Lambeth Bridge (there is a small sign indicating SJSS) then cross into Dean Stanley Street and you will see SJSS ahead in the middle of Smith Square. The Box Office and main entrance are to your right around the building.



This concert is sure to sell-out so book early to avoid disappointment
